

MSMTA GAIL F. MCDONALD HIGH SCHOOL PIANO EXAMINATIONS

The High School Piano Examinations Program is a unique example of how schools and professionals in the community work together to enhance students' educational options. Done in cooperation with the Maryland State Department of Education, this is the 37th year that this program has provided recognition, and in some cases credit, to piano students in their high school. Ann Matteson as the first chair, worked under the leadership of MSMTA president, Dr. Gail F. McDonald. Others who worked in the program at the origination were: Mary Jane Schaeffer, Gary Dinn, Dr. Stewart Gordon, and Ruth Weinberg. Working with the legislature and the Maryland State Department of Education's Director, Division of Instruction, Dr. James W. Lathan and Mr. James L. Tucker, Jr., Chief, Aesthetic and Gifted Programs. The examinations are unique in that they are open not only to MSMTA teachers' students, but to any Maryland student in grades 9 through 12 who studies piano privately. Letters and applications forms are sent out each fall to the principals and to music department heads of all public and private high schools in Maryland to tell them about the program. Students play a minimum of 10 minutes of memorized music from three different periods of music literature. They receive critiques from two judges, a certificate of achievement, and a report to be placed in their permanent record folder. Students taking the examination for credit must present 5 more minutes of adjudication time in technique over and above the memorized music.

This year we had 176 students take the examination. We are pleased to see this valuable program continue for the benefit of the students. The cost of the administering the program is \$5929.13, with income generated from fees \$5280.00 for a net loss of \$649.13.

THEORY TESTING PROGRAM

The 2016 Theory Examination had 1722 student registrations this year. Special thanks to the MSMTA members who spent countless hours making this exam possible, from our test planning committee to the chairs that run the local centers: Jeffrey Beaudry, Janet Berg, Deborah Brown, Anne Chen, Judith Dalton, Elena Eliseeva, Patricia Graham, Christopher Hall, David Holmes, Claudette Horwitz, Diane Kinsley, Anne Matteson, Karen Mihalko, June Miller, Dmitri Nazarenko, Bonnie Pausic, Ellen Sakai, Karen Skelly, Mary Stevens, and Junko Takahashi.

Theory centers generally ran smoothly with a few glitches here and there that we hope to address next year. Just a reminder, however, that if you put students into a center, even if you are transferring them in, you may be called upon to work at the center. We had issues with teachers registering students in two different centers on the same day, rendering them unable to work in one of the centers. There were a couple of noshows and last-minute cancellations for work assignments. This is unfair to the local chairs and may affect your students' eligibility for next year. If you unable to work at the exam, you have the option of finding a substitute to work in your place. This program takes a tremendous number of hours to implement and we need all teachers to assist in order to keep it running smoothly.

Test accuracy was improved this year and local chairs gave us feedback on frequently missed questions to assist in the test writing for next year. Because we have noted some areas with which students have problems, the theory committee has recommended implementing a few new policies for next year:

- At all levels, chords will be played blocked, broken ascending and broken descending.
- The points for any melodic dictation two measures or longer will be one point for correct melody and one point for correct rhythm, so the maximum number of points a student could miss would be two.
- Students at levels 5 and above must indicate major Roman number chords clearly by writing lines above and below the numeral. Samples will be shown in the addendum.
- For rhythmic and melodic dictations, the ear training recorders will actually tell the monitor to pause the CD between playings of the dictation. That way, the monitor can gauge in the live testing session how much time students need.

The revised syllabus is still in the works so we will continue to use the current syllabus and an addendum for the 2017 exam. Look for the addendum to be sent over the summer.

The committee has recommended keeping the 2015 exam as the sample for next year.

Beginning in 2017, transfers must be postmarked two weeks before the date of the new center in order to allow sufficient time to process.

Just a few clarifications about the theory honors awards:

- Students may earn each trophy only once. For example, a student can earn the Intermediate Award at level 5 for five 90%+ scores but cannot earn the same award again at levels 6 and 7.
- You can re-use levels for the Senior Theory Award that you used for the Intermediate Award as long as the application includes Level 8 or above at 90+%.
- For the Senior Theory Award, the Level 8 or higher exam must be 90%+, even if five other lower levels at 90% are submitted.
- If a student didn't score 90% on Level 8 but subsequently does so on a higher level, you can submit that higher level score instead with any other four 90%+ scores for the Senior Theory Award.

MIRIAM GOTTLIEB MEMORIAL COMPETITION

The Gottlieb Competition is one of MSMTA's most popular student events. Monetary prizes are given in each of the 21 individual groups. On the top level the first place is given in the memory of Gail McDonald. 
